Watch out for overhead lines while seeding

lease remember to work safely around overhead power lines during spring seeding. Be aware of power line heights and locations. While moving machinery, know the height of it. A good rule is to stay at least 10 feet away from high-voltage power this year, please be careful not to

If your piece of equipment or tractor comes in contact with a power line, stay inside and call for help. Keep others away as well. If you must leave the vehicle, do not allow your body to come in contact with the equipment and the ground at the same time, and jump as far away as possible. Once you are off, do not go back on until co-op personnel tells you it is

safe to do so. Always assume the power line is still energized.

In the U.S. every year approximately 60 farm workers are electrocuted. Play it safe, stay away from overhead power lines.

Also, while burning stubble burn power poles. Every year a few power poles are burned to the point they need to be replaced. This cost will be passed on to the person responsible.
